

# Tetbury Area Youth & Community Trust Annual Report 2023-24

TAYCT and Tetbury Youth Club have enjoyed another brilliant year! To make room for our ever-growing number of young people, we launched a third weekly youth club session for Year 7s and have been trialling a new after-school youth café for 11-16 year olds. Called Tea & Toast, this afternoon session offers young people a quiet place to be themselves, hang out with their friends, chat to our youth workers and grab a snack. We have also continued to learn and add to our calendar of holiday activities which was a project we first launched last year. We offer a variety of activities for children and young people of all ages, including youth drop-ins and family play sessions, cooking and craft workshops, family days out and supported youth trips on the public bus. We have been delighted by the numbers that come along to our sessions each holiday, and love hearing everyone's feedback about how fun and valued they are. The third part of our youth provision is mentoring, which is there to provide personal support, encourage and inspire young people to overcome challenges and to reach their goals and potential. This year, we have mentored 30 young people from Sir William Romney School and we are actively looking for further funding to continue this essential work next year.

We continue to apply for new sources of funding and have made great progress. TAYCT is primarily grant-funded, with money awarded by local government, community organisations and charitable foundations. The significant increase in our income this year enabled us to expand and deliver all the great new services mentioned. Local feedback is essential to the work we do. We work closely with young people, Tetbury Town Council, the Cotswold Youth Network and other local organisations to understand the needs in our community, and where TAYCT can make the greatest difference. We are a small charity with big ambitions for Tetbury and we hope to continue developing new and valuable services for the wider community, in addition to our youth work.

To close, I would like to say a special thank you to Lisa Hoult and our amazing team. I get to hear our youth workers observations behind the scenes, and Tetbury is so lucky to have a group of such caring adults who support our young people and really pay attention to what is going on for them in their world. Our young people are a valuable part of our community and we feel privileged to be a part of their journey.


